CLIMATE

The climate differs greatly between the north and south of Hyogo prefecture. The north (Tajima, Tamba) gets a lot of snow in winter (Dec-Feb) and temperatures may fall below freezing.



FOOD

Many hotels and restaurants in Japan are unable to provide special vegetarian or halal menus. Please check with your destination ahead of time if you have special dietary needs.



ONSEN (HOT SPRING)

Wearing a bathing suit in the ONSEN is not allowed. In some cases, you may be refused if you have tattoos. (In Japan, people with tattoos are generally assumed to be gangsters.)




MANNERS

Hyogo, the heart of Japan

Hyogo Prefecture is located in the center of Japan at 35 degrees north latitude and 135 degrees east longitude. Close to the ancient Japanese capital of Kyoto, Hyogo has a rich cultural background. Due to its convenient location, Hyogo is well-connected to other major cities by railroads and airlines.

Ancient history and rich culture


The area centering on Hyogo, Osaka and Kyoto is called the Kansai region, and until the capital was moved to Tokyo in 1868, it had been the center of Japan for more than 1,000 years. Thus Hyogo is home to many shrines, temples and castles ruins, including the World Heritage Himeji Castle, and is among the top regions in the country in terms of national treasures and important cultural properties. It also boasts the highest number of registered Japan Heritage sites.

Treasure House of Food

With the Japan Sea in the north and the Seto Inland Sea to the south, Hyogo is blessed with the bounty of both land and sea, such as Kani (crab), the king of winter cuisine, and premium branded Kobe beef. In this treasure house of food, a unique food culture flourishes in each area, showcasing the bounty of every season of the year.

Varied, rich regionality

Hyogo has been composed of five “countries” (regions) since the Edo period, the age of the samurai. Travelers can enjoy each region’s varied and unique culture and lifestyle.



KOBE · HANSHIN

This region has urban areas such as the international trading city of Kobe, and a rich arts and cultural scene.

HARIMA

Home to the World Heritage Himeji Castle, this area is steeped in history, with a large number of shrines, temples and castle ruins.

TAJIMA

Bordering on the Japan Sea in the north, this region gets a lot of snow in winter. Visitors can appreciate how nature and humans coexist here, in the breeding grounds of the Oriental White Stork.

TAMBA

There's a big temperature difference between day and night here. The fertile soil and pure water nurture the famous Tamba chestnuts, black beans and other crops.

AWAJI

This is the mythical “first island” of the Japanese islands. This is a resort island not far from Osaka and Kobe, where visitors can enjoy spending some leisurely time.

Explore Hyogo, The Origin of Japan

According to Japan's oldest historical chronicle Kojiki and Nihon Shoki, written more than 1,300 years ago, recounts how the Japanese islands were created when two gods, male and female, descended to the ocean, and the first to appear was Hyogo's Awaji Island. Thus, Hyogo is called the birthplace of Japan, also because it is close to the ancient Japanese capitals of Nara and Kyoto, and is said to have had a major influence on the powerful people of the time.

We hope you'll enjoy experiences that can be had only here in Hyogo, with its ancient history and culture passed down unbroken through the generations, blessed with good food, onsen and other natural resources.

"Landscape in Rokko", fusion of 10 million dollar nightscape and artistic light show on Mt Rokko (Japanese-style Mongolian mutton BBQ included)

Mt. Rokko Art of Lights "Light Scape in Rokko" is an illumination using LED lighting that can reproduce more than 10 million colors to light up the frame that covers the entire observatory. Lighting designer Masayuki Fushimi has created a landscape that feels familiar to us, using light. The illumination changes with the seasons, and together with the 10-million-dollar nightscape seen from Mt Rokko, it is incredibly romantic. Experience this fantastical spectacle and its seasonal transitions.

This ironware continues to command strong support from Japanese and overseas professionals alike for its chef's knives and carpenter's tools. This is the only place in the world where you can experience working alongside the craftsmen to manufacture a knife, and then taste sake from the local brewery.

Workshop on making "Sugidama", symbol of Japanese sake

Sake is made from white rice and pure water only. Hyogo prefecture boasts the largest production volume of the best kind of brewer's rice, Yamada-Nishiki. As it grows, that rice receives the blessing of the mountains where cedar trees, said to be a home of the gods, flourish. We invite you to try your hand at making the symbol of Japanese sake, the "sugidama", and discover the links between sake and cedars, while enjoying the satoyama scenery, where nature and humans coexist in harmony.

* Sugidama is a ball made of cedar hung by sake brewers in the eaves of the brewery to let people know that a new brew has been produced

Explore Hanshin Area: Frank Lloyd Wright Architecture and Koshien Baseball Stadium

Hanshinkan Modernism is a type of art, culture and lifestyle that developed from the early 1900s through the 1930s in hanshinkan, the region between Osaka and Kobe, and was heavily influenced by Western culture. Modernist architecture skillfully harmonizes traditional Japanese beauty of form with modern design, resulting in a stunning blend of Japanese and Western styles. On this tour you'll see some of the remaining examples of exquisite Modernist architecture, in particular the Yodoko Guest House (formerly the Yamamura residence), designed by one of the three giants of Modernist architecture, Frank Lloyd Wright.

Immerse yourself in nature at Sorakuen Garden, a traditional Japanese garden in Kobe

Sorakuen Garden is a sprawling "chisen-kaiyushiki" garden with stepping stones, stone bridges, streams, and a waterfall surround by a central pond. Young and old alike will enjoy the scenery like deep mountain valleys. The grounds are full of nature, with large camphor trees said to be some 500 years old, azaleas in spring, and maple trees in beautiful autumn colors. The 20,000 square meter garden contains important cultural assets such as the stables of the former Koderashi Family residence, the old Hassam House, the Funeyakata building.

"Banshu-ori" weaving workshop: It starts with nostalgic sounds

Banshu-ori is a traditional weaving method specific to Hyogo prefecture's Northern Banshu region. The threads of the cotton fabric are dyed before weaving, and it is famed for its natural texture and rich colors. 80% of Japanese yarn-dyed fabrics are produced in this region. On the tour you'll learn why Banshu-ori weaving thrives in this region, you'll hear the sound of the loom and talks by the weavers, and experience the soft touch of Banshu-ori for yourself.



Take the opportunity to create a small item using Banshu-ori in the Kyukishike house, a fine old farmhouse built in the first flush Banshu-ori's prosperity.

The quintessence of INAKA, the spirit and art of Tamba

This tour takes you to Tamba's Kasuga-cho, the birthplace of the top quality adzuki bean "Tamba Dainagon Adzuki", purveyed to the imperial household for the past 300 years. You'll visit a farm that produces adzuki and feast on homemade local dishes using the beans. Then carry on to the atelier of an English potter living in Tamba, the studio of an artisan who makes hand-woven, naturally dyed Tamba-fu cloth, and a climbing kiln. Of course you'll mingle with the local people, as well as gain an appreciation for the spirit and art that dwell in this place. After the visits, enjoy a teatime break at Tamba Kasuga-cho's famous Locasse Tamba.

Experience Japanese traditional craftsmanship: Toyooka wicker baskets and short cruise on the Maruyama River

Toyooka Kiryu Zaiku (wicker craft), a traditional Japanese craft, goes back more than 1,200 years and emerged from the rich terrain around the Maruyama River. Today Toyooka is famous for making bags and baskets. Experience the natural surroundings of the Maruyama River and learn about Toyooka's history on a mini-cruise, then try your hand at basket weaving at the Genbudo Museum. Later, take a stroll in the Genbudo Park, one of Japan's natural monuments.



Toyooka Kiryu Zaiku
 It is the traditional craft of willow basket weaving. The willow species used, Salix koriyanagi, is both supple and strong and overflows with warm charm. These days it is attracting attention with new designs for willow bags with fashionable elements, and is even used by the imperial family.

The Awaji Puppet Joruri is a puppet show that developed from Shinto rituals. This aspect of popular culture is deeply rooted on Awaji Island and has a long history of more than 500 years. Each group of three people operates one puppet, and it would not be an exaggeration to say that the plays, passed down for generations and enacted with great elegance, convey the essence of Japan's proud performing arts. The puppets, appearing even more alive than humans, express emotional drama that invites spectators into a world of dreams.


Cruise tour to extraordinary natural wonder, The Whirlpools of Naruto Strait

"Uzushio" is a rare natural phenomenon caused by the tide rushing through the extremely narrow Naruto Strait between Awaji Island and Shikoku. The moon's tidal force causes these whirlpools, which means that especially large ones can be seen around the times of the new and full moons. These whirlpools are among the largest in the world, with diameters of about 30 meters. In addition to viewing the whirlpools close-up, the "Uzushio" cruise also offers the opportunity to learn from an on-board guide about how the whirlpools are generated and their natural environment.

Let's play "Fukimodoshi", a traditional Japanese toy on Awaji Island

Everyone all over Japan knows the traditional Japanese toy the "Fukimodoshi". In Japan, they're also called Piropiro and Peehyara, while in other countries they're called party horns and blowouts, and are used at birthday, Christmas and other parties.

Take a tour of the Fukimodoshi factory and exhibits, and play with more than 10 different types of Fukimodoshi. Not only that, but you can choose from a variety of colors and patterns to make your own original Fukimodoshi, included in the tour.



Japanese Fukimodoshi

In the 1960s, the high quality of Japanese Fukimodoshi led to their export to countries around the world: the US and Canada, Europe, Russia, Brazil and more. These days Fukimodoshi are used widely not just as toys, but for medical, therapeutic and beauty purposes, as well.

The Nojima Fault Preservation Museum contains the actual active fault line that appeared when the Great Hanshin-Awaji Earthquake Disaster occurred on January 17, 1995. Other attractions in the park include the Memorial House, which remained largely undamaged although very near the fault, and the Kobe Wall, which survived the bombing of Kobe (1945) and the Hanshin-Awaji earthquake. You can also experience what an earthquake feels like in the earthquake simulator. The aim of this theme park is to raise awareness of the danger of natural disasters and pass the lesson on to future generations.



The Mio area had a flourishing fishing industry, but now no vestiges remain. The local women are striving to revitalize the area by making and selling local cuisine unique to Mio. Their next challenge is an inbound initiative, SASHIMI.

Onsenji Temple Hot Spring Therapy Tour

Standing at the western edge of Kinokawa-cho, Onsen-ji temple's main building dates from 738. In times gone by, visitors to this onsen town would pray at the temple to be cured of illnesses, and be blessed with water by the guardian deity. Only then could they receive a wooden dipper and be admitted to the hot baths. The wooden dipper was the entry ticket to the baths, and the custom endured until the Edo period. On this tour, the chief priest will tell you more about these ancient rituals, the history of Onsenji Temple and the story of Kinokawa Onsen's founder.

 Kinokawa Onsen boasts a two-star listing in the Michelin Green Guide Japan. From the mountaintop you can take in magnificent views of the town and the gently flowing Maruyama river, with the Japan Sea coastline in the distance. At the top of the mountain, you can try your hand at the famous "kawarake-nage", throwing unglazed pottery called "kawarake" at a target, to drive away bad fortune and ask for good luck.

Tajima-Guro
 Extremely rare even among Tajima beef (the source of Kobe beef). Tajima-Guro is raised only on approved farms and fed special food, and just 2-3 cows are shipped monthly. Its fat melting point is low, at 12°C, while that of ordinary Japanese Black beef is about 25°C, and the large amount of oleic and linoleic acids in the umami component has been verified.
